Prayer Of Confession

This requires us to educate ourselves and speak up against harmful behaviour. From the Affirm and Accessibility Committee

Affirm Terminology for December... December 3rd is International Day of Persons with Disabilities. This month we focus on equity for people with disabilities. Celebrated around the world, this day mobilizes support for critical issues relating to the inclusion of persons with disabilities, promotes awareness-raising about disability issues and draws attention to the benefits of an inclusive and accessible society for all.

One example of change that is happening to help society embrace the energy and capabilities of disabled people is the **Accessible Icon Project**. Started in 2016, the Accessible Icon Project designed a new wheelchair icon that shows action and forward movement. One disabled person noted about the new icon "the chair is part of the person, the person isn't part of the chair!" For more information and free downloadable versions of this new icon, visit accessibleicon.org.

Recently, the East Central Ontario Regional Council hosted a book study related to people living with disabilities. The book that we discussed is titled **My Body is Not a Prayer Request** by Amy Kenny. It is an eye-opening and informative read about the challenges and discrimination that disabled people face every day, written by a woman who has lived with a disability since a young age. We highly recommend this book if you want to better understand the lived experience of disabled people, especially as it relates to the oppression they face from organizations such as churches.

Hate Crimes Against 2SLGBTQIA+ Community Surge

An alarming trend of escalating hate crimes targeting the 2SLGBTQIA+ community has been brought to light in a recent Statistics Canada report. The data shows a staggering 225% increase in hate crimes based on sexual orientation over the past five years. The United Church of Canada has also seen a concerning rise in hate-related incidents directed at its affirming communities. These senseless acts, including vandalism, harassment, and online abuse, highlight the urgent need for increased awareness and support. Please join us tonight, Sunday, December 1st, at 7:00 p.m. on the church steps for a candlelight vigil and to sing songs of peace and love. Together, we will demonstrate our solidarity against hatred and violence. Together, we will make a difference in creating a better world for everyone!
